CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CLEARANCE TRANSFERS – UPDATED GUIDANCE

SB 1093 (Hurtado) amended Health and Safety Code (HSC) sections 1522, 1568.09, 1569.17, and 1569.871 for licensure categories, excluding Home Care Services, to require an individual to submit a request for a transfer of a criminal record clearance on a form provided by the Department or via the Department's secure online portal, named Guardian, and eliminated the requirement that the individual submit a copy of their driver's license or other valid government identification with their request for a transfer of a criminal record clearance. On the licensee's request, the Department will verify whether the individual has a transferable clearance, and the licensee will be responsible for validating the subject's identity.

The amendments took effect on January 1, 2023.

SB 1093 also amended HSC section 1796.24 for Home Care Services to permit an individual to request a transfer of a criminal record clearance or exemption on a form provided by the Department or through the Department's secure online portal, eliminating the requirement that the home care organization applicant or licensee make the request. In addition, the revisions eliminated the requirement that the request include a copy of the individual's driver's license or other government-issued identity. In addition, upon request by the applicant or licensee, the Department will verify whether the individual has a transferable clearance or exemption, and the applicant or licensee will be responsible for verifying the individual's identity.

FLU OR COVID-19: THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A FLU AND COVID-19

Flu season typically occurs in the United States during the fall and winter. Although influenza viruses spread throughout the year, flu activity typically peaks between December and February. Season to season, the influenza's health impact (infections, hospitalizations, and deaths) tends to vary.

COVID-19 and influenza can cause comparable symptoms. However, there are a number of distinctions between them.

The novel coronavirus strain (SARS-CoV-2) is responsible for coronavirus disease 19 (COVID-19).

COVID-19 and influenza are both contagious respiratory diseases that spread from person to person.

Flu Symptoms

- Fever
- Malaise
- Headache
- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Reduced sense of smell
- Metallic taste in mouth
- Chills
- Cough
- Body pain or muscle pain
- Sore throat

These symptoms can also occur in people with COVID-19.

COVID-19 Symptoms

- Fever
- Shortness of breath
- Dry cough
- Fatique
- Headache
- Muscle or body aches
- New loss of smell or taste
- Nausea
- Diarrhea

Not all individuals with COVID-19 exhibit all of these symptoms. Some individuals may exhibit cold-like symptoms without a fever. Others may only experience a loss of smell or taste, while others may exhibit no symptoms whatsoever.

Key Differences between COVID-19 and Influenza:

Influenza "Flu"

The majority of those infected with influenza will recover on their own within a few days to two weeks, but others will have severe complications and may require hospitalization. With influenza, secondary bacterial infections are more common than with COVID-19.

Diarrhea is more common in young children than in adults with influenza.



COVID-19

Additional COVID-19 problems include blood clots in the veins and arteries of the lungs, heart, legs, or brain.

Post-COVID problems can affect everyone who has had COVID-19, even if their illness was mild or they had no symptoms. Post-COVID Conditions refer to a range of symptoms that may persist for weeks or months after initial infection with the virus that causes COVID-19, or emerge weeks after first infection.

PIN 23-05-ASC - INFORMATIONAL CALL REGARDING CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19): END OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY AND WHAT IT MEANS FOR ADULT AND SENIOR CARE

Effective April 3, 2023

Note: The State of California will no longer require COVID-19 vaccination and boosters for staff in ASC facilities and programs

Licensees will no longer be required to maintain records of workers' COVID-19 vaccination or exemption status. All facility staff are encouraged to stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters as this remains the most important strategy to prevent serious illness and death from COVID-19

Isolation and Quarantine Update

All Persons with COVID-19 Symptoms

<u>Regardless of vaccination status or previous infection</u>, all persons with COVID-19 symptoms should:

- Self-isolate and test as soon as possible
- Knowing you have COVID-19 allows access to treatment and notification of close contacts
- For symptomatic people who have tested positive in the previous 31-90 days, an antigen test is recommended because PCR can detect noninfectious virus fragments for up to 90 days
- If symptoms persist and test is negative, consider continuing self-isolation and retesting in 1-2 days. Repeat testing every 1-2 days until test is positive or symptoms improve
- If test is positive, follow recommendations for Isolation

PIN 23-05-ASC - INFORMATIONAL CALL REGARDING CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19): END OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY AND WHAT IT MEANS FOR ADULT AND SENIOR CARE

Isolation

New guidance on Isolation:

- Persons with COVID-19 may leave isolation after Day 5 if:
 - √ they have no symptoms, or
- √symptoms are mild or improving and they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication
- Persons recovering from COVID-19 should wear a well-fitting face mask around others through Day 10
- After ending isolation, persons with COVID-19 may remove their mask sooner than Day 10 if
- √ they have no symptoms, or symptoms are mild or improving and they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, AND
 - √ they have two sequential negative tests one day apart.

Close Contacts

Quarantine is not required

It is recommended that individuals with close contact but without COVID-19 symptoms, <u>regardless of vaccination status</u>

- test immediately unless they have been infected in the last 30 days
- test again 3-5 days after the exposure
- wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially indoors around high-risk people
- persons infected in the last 31-90 days should also follow this guidance, even if asymptomatic

High Risk Contacts

A high-risk contact is someone who:

- may experience severe illness if they become infected with COVID19
- for example, due to being elderly, unvaccinated or immunocompromised
- may be more likely to transmit the virus to those who are at higher risk for severe COVID-19
- has higher transmission potential, i.e.
 is more likely to spread virus to others
- due to high intensity/duration of indoor exposure to others

Infectious Period

New definition of the infectious period for COVID-19:

- For symptomatic confirmed cases, 2 days before the confirmed case had any symptoms (symptom onset date is Day 0) through Days 5-10 after symptoms first appeared AND 24 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of fever-reducing medications, and symptoms have improved, OR
- For asymptomatic confirmed cases, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date (collection date is Day 0) through Day 5 after positive specimen collection date for their first positive COVID-19 test.



MASKING UPDATE



Updated Masking Guidance

Regardless of COVID-19 community levels, CDPH recommends:

- Wear a mask around others if you have respiratory symptoms
- Consider wearing a mask in indoor areas of public transportation and transportation hubs
- When choosing to wear a mask, ensure your mask provides the best fit and filtration
- If you've had a significant exposure to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, wear a mask for 10 days

Note: no person can be prevented from wearing a mask as a condition of participation in an activity or entry into a care site unless wearing a mask would pose a safety hazard

Licensees are encouraged to improve ventilation and air quality in their facility to prevent airborne respiratory infections and improve indoor air quality

Both the California State Senate and Assembly convened for an organizational session on December 5, 2022, to kick off the 2023-2024 legislation session. At this time, each house also formally elected their leadership. Senate Pro Tem Toni Atkins will continue to remain the leader of the Senate. In the Assembly, the Democratic Caucus met following the elections and determined that Assembly Speaker Rendon (termed out in 2024) will continue to serve as Speaker, but relinquish the position to Assembly Member Robert Rivas (Salinas) on June 30th, at the conclusion of the 2023-24 state budget deliberations.

With nearly a fourth of the Legislature being newly elected this year, we will see a number of new committee chairmanships and committee assignments. New members will face a challenging environment with the decline in expected state revenues and likely deficit. Additionally, the Governor has officially called a special session regarding oil and gas prices that started December 5th, but the Legislature will not start its deliberations until the new year.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES



With the Legislature reconvening in January, 6beds lobbyists will be pursuing legislation to allow 6beds members to expand the number of rooms they can rent in their facilities (depending on available space) as well as legislation to improve the process associated with referral agencies – transparency around the fees that they charge and information provided to prospective residents and their families.

General Election Update

On November 8th, California held its General Election to vote on all state constitutional offices, all Assembly seats (80), and half (20) of the Senate seats. Although there is one race that is undergoing a recount, it appears that the overall makeup of the Legislature will not significantly change. The Legislature will continue with a Democratic supermajority – the Senate will include 32 Democrats and 8 Republicans, and the Assembly will include 62 Democrats and 18 Republicans. The ability of Democrats to hold on to a supermajority, with more than two-thirds of the seats in each house, allows them to determine the Legislature's priorities and positions on an array of the state budget, tax, and policy issues.

PIN 23-01-ASC - (Supersedes PIN 21-35-ASC) Annual Inspections Using The Compliance And Regulatory Enforcement (CARE) Tools

- This PIN supersedes PIN 21-35-ASC, dated July 30, 2021, and announces the resumption for the full use of CARE Tools for annual inspections of Adult and Senior Care facilities.
- During and after the launch of the full ASC CARE Tools, CCLD will continue to evaluate and research the effects and efficiency of the CARE Tools.

PIN 23-02-ASC - Updated Guidance On Testing, Isolation And Quarantine, And Masking For Staff And Residents At Adult And Senior Care Facilities

- This PIN provides an updated guide on Adult and Senior Care (ASC) facility licensees on testing, isolation and quarantine, and masking for facility staff and residents. Licensees no longer need to conduct daily temperature checks of residents unless the screening measures above result in concern about COVID-19 symptoms.
- Licensees are not required to conduct routine diagnostic screening testing for COVID19 for asymptomatic facility staff, regardless of vaccination status.

PIN 23-03-ASC - Informational Call Regarding Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19): Care Tools, State of Emergency, Updated Guidance And Therapeutics

- Beginning March 1, 2023, annual inspections will resume to focus on all health and safety requirements necessary to support compliance with statutes and regulations applicable to ASC facilities.
- The COVID-19 State of Emergency (SOE) in California will end on February 28, 2023 which entails (1) COVID-19 related waivers end on February 28, 2023, (2) Facilities will have to resume regular pre-SOE operations (3) All licensing requirements will be reinstated as of March 1, 2023.

- Guardian provides functionality which allows you to search for a
 person utilizing an application number or by utilizing a combination of
 identifying information. (i.e. social security number, identity
 document, personnel identification number (Per ID), last name or date
 of birth).
- The search function allows you to quickly access the Person Summary page of an applicant or employee.

- The State of California will no longer require COVID-19 vaccination and boosters for staff in ASC facilities and programs Licensees will no longer be required to maintain records of workers' COVID-19 vaccination or exemption status.
- Licensees are encouraged to improve ventilation and air quality in their facility to prevent airborne respiratory infections and improve indoor air quality. High-risk settings should make respirators (e.g., N95s, KN95s, KF94s) with good fit or surgical masks available to any residents and staff who would like to use them.


